## Early Years Pupil Premium Statement 2025-26

The Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP) is additional funding for early years settings to improve the education they provide for disadvantaged 3 and 4 year olds. An additional 62p per hour is awarded per eligible child. We monitor closely what impact this money has made on the progress made by the children eligible for EYPP.



**Aim: To improve progress and attainment for children eligible for EYPP in order to narrow the gap with their peers.**

The main barriers to learning faced by children who are eligible for EYPP are speech, language and communication difficulties. These barriers have been identified through the completion of on-entry screening. We use this information to set specific speech and language targets. We also plan 1:1 language support time, paired and small group speech and language intervention groups. The impact of this work is measured through the use of the WELLCOMM speech and language assessment tool with summary reports that document progress made and next steps.
